


Maths Methods used in Year 4

We want to share with you the ways we teach the four operations in Year 4.

Addition

1. Use a place value grid to model exchanging.




2. Use column addition to complete the calculation.

1. Use a place value grid to show how to exchange.




2. Use column subtraction to complete the calculation.

1. Use a place value equipment to support understanding.




2. Use expanded and formal column method to complete the calculation.

Division

1. Partition the number into known multiples to solve.

$39 \div 3 = ?$




$39 = 30 + 9$

$30 \div 3 = 10$

$9 \div 3 = 3$

$39 \div 3 = 13$

2. Use place value manipulatives to support the idea of a remainder.



$72 \div 5 = 14 \text{ remainder } 2$
